AND A DASH -8 AIRCRAFT**

Nairobi, 5th March, 2024... Kenya Civil Aviation Authority wishes to confirm that an aircraft accident occurred at 10:05hrs involving a Cessna aircraft belonging to Ninety-Nines Flying School and a Dash 8 belonging to Safarilink Aviation Limited.

Investigations have commenced through various agencies led by the Air Accident Investigation Department (AAID) and the National Police Service to establish the cause of the accident.

Safety of the public, property, and operations remains paramount to the Kenya Civil Aviation Authority.
